



RENEWABLE ENERGY-WHITTLE HILL FARM BUILDINGS

Our evening at the Renewable Energy Technology Centre at Whittle Hill Farm Buildings was a great success. Members will know that this is a special project of Professor Tony Marmont, husband of committee member Angela Marmont.

We saw the transformation of a 200 year-old ruin into a 21st century working complex. The centre is energy efficient, set in the heart of the English countryside. In cooperation with the Universities of Nottingham, Loughborough and Leicester practical research is going on to produce answers to the world's needs when fossil fuels run out.

The centre is not connected to a sewage system, is selfsufficient in water and generates much of its own electricity. It is airconditioned and a fine working example to us all of a pleasant, efficient working environment. Tony Marmont, a real enthusiast, gave us a thought provoking evening.
