The Friends of Charnwood Forest

Just 20 years ago, a group of Leicestershire people, lovers of Charnwood Forest, but aware of the constant threats to it from development, traffic, mineral extraction, litter and cultural vandalism came together under the presidency of the Lord Lieutenant for Leicestershire, the late Colonel Sir Andrew Martin, to form The Friends of Charnwood Forest.

It was inaugurated on 8th April 1986 at a public meeting held at Oaks-in-Charnwood Village Hall. Many of the founders are still members of the Society and Lady Martin, Dick Burrows, Peter Bertram and Tony Milner are still committee members, whilst Barbara Bassett has just retired.

Since then the membership has grown steadily, now numbering nearly 200. In these 20 years the Society has extended its activities in many ways, from monitoring planning applications, raising funds for schemes such as Martin's Wood and increasing awareness of the Forest, its beauties and the threats to it.

Every year we have had a varied programme of visits, talks and social events. Bradgate Park has provided a central focus on geology, deer conservation and local history whilst about 90 meetings have been held, covering everything from sewage to barn-owls! Perhaps our greatest single achievement was to raise over £13,000 to buy 12 acres of land in Deans Lane, Woodhouse Eaves to form part of the National Forest. This land, planted with oak, ash and other native species, is now managed by the Woodland Trust and dedicated as 'Martin's Wood' as a permanent memorial to the efforts of the late Sir Andrew Martin on behalf of the people of Leicestershire.

Today, the Society is in good heart and good hands, with a dedicated and hard working committee, looking confidently forward to the next 20 years.

In this newsletter are photographs of a few of our events. You will recognise many of our members and hopefully recall some very happy and successful times together.

















